The Road Ahead to 2009

The Nature's Yarns NewsFlash has a new look and an additional logo. Nature's Yarns has been accepted to use the International Year of Natural Fibres 2009 logo to raise awareness of natural fibers.

The General Assembly of the United Nations on 20 December 2006 proclaimed 2009 the International Year of Natural Fibres. In doing so, it invited FAO, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations to facilitate the observance of the Year, in collaboration with Governments, regional and international organizations, nongovernmental organizations, the private sector and relevant organizations of the United Nations system.

There is a wide diversity of natural fibres, animal and vegetable

in origin, and in the past there has been little contact between the industries or between the international organizations and other bodies which service these industries.

The goal is to help bring the various groups together, share information and ideas about the International Year of Natural Fibres in particular and about natural fibres in general.

We carry such fibers and are looking for more. Do you know where your fibers are made?

- Brown Sheep Company. Scouring, carding and combing is done in SC and the rest of the production is done in the Nebraska mill.
- Kollage Yarns. The cotton used in the HOPE USA line

- is grown, harvested and processed in AL and then shipped to mills throughout the US for spinning, plying and dyeing.
- Kraemer Yarns come from Nazareth, PA.
- Tilli Tomas yarns come from India and some are dyed in Jamaica Plains, MA.
- Trendsetter is located in Van Nuys, CA and some of the yarns we carry come from Italy.
- Maggiknits USA is located in MI and her yarns come from Italy and Spain.

What are Yarn Tastings?

Think wine tasting but instead of tasting a collection of wine, you will be tasting (with your hands & choice of needles) a collection of different YARNS with a group of fiberholics. It's a great opportunity to visit with friends and since our fine yarns are different, it

affords you the opportunity to TASTE before you buy.

All participates will receive mini skeins (approximately 5-25 yds) of at least five (5) yarns along with some edible goodies and a 20% off coupon (expires in 60 days) toward the purchase of the featured yarns that day or saved till later.

Skill Builder Descriptions & Information

Beading Skill Builders

Intro to Beads-\$30

Have you been wondering how to make your own jewelry? This is the class for you. Students will learn beading terminology, the various components used in bead stringing, and step-by-step techniques to make a bracelet using tiger tail wire, crimp tubes, Swarovski crystals, and a toggle clasp. After this class, you will be able to make necklaces also using the same techniques. It's easy and fun. You can design jewelry to go with particular outfits or as gifts. If you have beading tools, please bring them. \$25 Materials fee paid to the instructor.

1 2-hr session

Intro to Peyote Beading—\$45

Peyote stitch is one of the most frequently used stitches in beadwork and is also used to decorate any kind of cylinder such as key chains, bottles, lighters, quartz crystals, and writing pens. Peyote is mostly recognized in Indian art around antlers and basket handles. In this class you will learn the art of beading a wooden cylinder needle case and how to add a beaded strap to wear as jewelry. \$TBD Materials fee paid to the instructor.

2 2-hr sessions

Crochet Skill Builders

Beginning Crochet—\$50

Crochet is enjoying a renaissance and the latest word is – "It's Hip to Crochet!" Designers are now publishing fashionable and interesting patterns and books like those published for knitting. Learn the five basic stitches of crochet: chain stitch (foundation), single, double, half double and triple crochet stitches as well as learn how to shape an item with increasing/decreasing, make a granny square, changing colors, and learn different ways to begin a foundation row. Additional skills and/or topics may be covered. Materials needed: Light colored worsted weight yarn and appropriate hook. Also, bring a pattern if you have project in mind.

2 2-hr sessions

Date: Mon. 1/19 & Wed. 1/28 Time: 6:00—8:00 pm

Hairpin Lace—\$50

Hairpin lace creates beautiful open fabrics that look complicated and impressive! The dirty little secret is that this technique is so simple, even a beginning crocheter can do it! Come

learn how to: The basics of creating a hairpin lace strip and an introduction to several techniques you can use to join strips. **Materials needed:** Hairpin Lace Loom, tapestry needle, a variety of crochet hook sizes, various yarns in different weights including a smooth, non-variegated, worsted weight yarn.

2 2-hr sessions

Date: Thur. 2/19 & 2/26 Time: 6:00—8:00 pm

Tunisian Crochet—\$50

Learn how to use this traditional technique (also called Afghan Stitch) in very untraditional ways. Using large hooks and modern yarns, create fabrics that look woven instead of knit or crochet. Tunisian crochet uses less yarn than standard crochet, and is considered by many to be a cross between knitting and crochet. We will cover the basic stitches in Tunisian Crochet and view some FAST and EASY projects. Students should know the fundamentals of crochet. Materials needed: At least 3 coordinating bulky weight (any yarn including ribbons that yields gauge of 2.5 sts/inch or less), a smooth, non-variegated bulkyweight yarn, and variety crochet hook sizes.

Knitting Technique Skill Builders

Beginning Knitting—\$100

This is a basic learn-how-to-knit class. Beginners learn the basics of casting on, knitting, purling, and casting off while creating a garment of their choice. We'll also cover other techniques such as increasing, decreasing, and pattern reading. **Materials needed:** Students pay for materials they use.

4 2-hr sessions

Date: Fri. 1/16, 1/23, 1/30 & 2/6

Time: 10:00—Noon

Date: Tue. 2/3, 2/10, 2/17 & 2/24

Continental Knitting—\$30

Have you been considering making the change from English/US knitting to the Continental style? Learn how to knit (and purl) in the Continental way. Discover this method's benefits and drawbacks. **Materials needed**: At least 100 yards of light colored, smooth, worsted weight yarn and appropriate needles.

12-hr session

Correcting Errors (Oops! Class)—\$45

Drop a stitch? Purled when you should have knitted? This fundamental class is a must! Learn to pick up dropped stitches, tink (unknitting stitch by stitch), untwist your stitches without a lot of effort, prevent too many/too few stitches, and the correction and prevention of many other common knitting mistakes Materials needed:

1 3-hr session Date: Sat. 1/24 Time: 10:00—1:00pm

Family (1 adult & 1 child) Knitting Affair-\$150 (\$25 additional child/\$50 additional adult)

This is a basic learn-how-to-knit class for adults and children (age 7-14) to learn to knit together. Each group will learn the basics of casting on, knitting, purling, and casting off while creating a project of their choice. We'll also cover other techniques such as increasing, decreasing, and pattern reading. Materials needed: Students pay for materials they

4 2-hr sessions

Friday Nite Techniques -- \$30 each

1 2-hr sessions

Short Rows (used for shaping)—We'll use them in existing patterns. Materials needed: Bring worsted weight yarns (multiple colors) and appropriate needles for swatching and playing.

Date: Fri. 2/27 Time: 6:00—8:00pm

Basic Seaming—We'll practice seaming techniques and discuss when to use them. Materials needed: All students should bring at least 4 swatches, 2 in garter stitch and 2 in stockinette stitch, tapestry needles, and scrap yarn. Please use worsted weight yarn in light colors.

Date: Fri. 2/13 Time: 6:00—8:00pm

- Intarsia—Be Bold! Add more color to your work! Go beyond the simple stripes and learn the basics of changing colors in a row while creating a quick headband. We'll cover the different methods of working with multiple colors and tips and tricks for working with blocks of color. Materials needed: Several colors of worsted weight yarn, appropriate needles, a crochet hook, and a darning/tapestry needle.
- Fair Isle (stranded)—Learn the Fair Isle method for adding color and interest to your knitted pieces! Learn the basics of stranded knitting – holding one color in

each hand. We'll create a sample in class and discuss various tips and tricks and how to avoid the notorious bunching. Materials needed: Several colors of worsted weight yarn, appropriately sized needles, a crochet hook, and a darning/tapestry needle.

Date: Fri. 2/20 Time: 6:00—8:00pm

© Cables—Confused by cables? Baffled by bobbles? Don't be intimidated! Learn the basics behind cables and Aran patterns. Knit a basic cable, a bobble and several variations. We'll also try out several types of cable needles. Materials needed: Light colored worsted weight yarn and appropriately sized knitting needles, a cable needle if you have one.

Date: Fri. 3/13 Time: 6:00—8:00pm

Gauge—Learn why to make a gauge swatch, how to make and use a gauge swatch, and what to do with it when it is done. A fundamental class to aid in preventing the basic knitter's aggravation – knitting the wrong size

Date: Fri. 3/27 Time: 6:00—8:00pm

Intermediate Knitting Techniques—\$65

Take your knitting to the next level. Learn about yarn weights, commonly used abbreviations in patterns, increase, decrease, basic cables, multiple cast-on and various stitch patterns to build your skills. **Materials** needed: Smooth, light colored yarn (DK to bulky) with appropriate needles for yarn.

2 2-hr sessions

Kids Knitting—\$30

This class is for ages 7 to 12 that would like to learn to knit or improve basic knitting skills. Learn to cast on, knit, and cast off to make a wonderful project. **Materials needed:** Students pay for materials they use.

Seams/Finishing—\$50

Learn various seaming techniques to finish your garments professionally. You will learn mattress stitch, crochet seams, and three needle bind off. We will also discuss the benefits of blocking. Materials needed: Six 4"x4" swatches in light colored worsted weight yarns: four stockinette bound off & two stockinette on stitch holders. DPNs will be needed in the appropriate size corresponding to the needle size used of the unbound off swatches. Darning needles are encouraged, but not required. Also encouraged to bring garment/project that needs to be sewn together to finish in class.

1 3-hr session

Knitting Project Skill Builders

Baby/Adult Surprise Jacket Project—\$75

A fun complicated looking puzzle for knitters that is really easy. Learn how to knit and finish the fascinating popular Elizabeth Zimmerman Baby Surprise Jacket that has delighted knitters for decades. Makes a classic sweater that is great for a baby gift. Must have a firm knowledge of cast on, knit, purl, and bind off. *Note:* To choose needle size, knit swatches in garter stitch (knit every row) and choose the size that gives you feel that you like. Don't forget to block the swatch before making final decision. Materials needed: For Baby: 300-500 yds of DK or worsted weight yarn and 24" circular appropriate needles for gauge. Knitter's Workshop, or The Opinionated Knitter or the Baby/Adult Surprise pattern all by Elizabeth Zimmerman.

3 2-hr sessions

Advanced Beginner Lace Scarf—\$60

Intarsia Knitting (Color Work)—\$30

Love those beautiful blocks of color in knitted pieces? We'll learn how to add in blocks of color using bobbins and small "butterfly" balls of yarn. We'll make swatches of various colors and discuss creating your own pattern with intarsia knitting. Materials needed: Small amounts (2-3 oz) of several colors of yarn with appropriate sized needles.

12-hr session

Knit a Beret Project—\$50

The classic beret has never gone out of style, but it is certainly popular these days! Learn how to make a custom beret using any weight of yarn. Students must know how to knit in the round using double pointed needles (DPNs) and have a firm knowledge of cast on, bind off, knit and purl. Materials needed: Approximately 200 yards of worsted/bulky weight yarn or approximately 300 yards of sport/DK weight yarn, 1 set of DPNs in a size appropriate for yarn weight, (optional) 1 16" circular needles appropriate for yarn weight.

2 2-hr sessions

Knitting in the Round—\$30

Knitting in the round is a valuable skill for knitters to master. Seamless sweaters, hats and mittens are all made using this method. Learn to knit in the round and all the tricks to using double pointed needles and circular needles while completing a project of choice. Students must have a firm grasp of knit, purl, cast on and bind off. Materials needed: Bring to class worsted weight yarn, DPNs, & tapestry needle.

1 3-hr session

Toe Up Socks—\$50

Socks are HOT and portable! The "toe up fit

as you knit" method gives knitters a fast and easy method of knitting socks that actually fit their feet. Class covers casting on in both figure-eight and closed toe cast on, increasing the toe, and two heel shaping methods for great looking fit as you knit socks. ets & collars, crazy quilts, Christmas ornaments, etc. Unlike crocheting, tatting consists of only one stitch, the double stitch. Tatting is very portable and uses very little thread compared to crocheting. A shuttle and some thread can be placed in a sandwich bag in your purse to keep you company wherever you go. Learn the correct ways of loading the shuttle, holding and manipulating shuttle and thread to make the basic stitch as well as picots, chains, and joins with large yarn and then progress to smaller threads and more challenging patterns. We will also cover reading charts and, if time permits, 2-shuttle tatting techniques. Materials needed: Shuttle at least 2.5" long, but not longer than 3.5", 2 Colors of thread (thicker is better to start). Small crochet hook (shuttles may have this on the tip), pair scissors or other thread cutting tool, notebook to hold your printouts/samples.

3 2-hr sessions

Weaving Skill Builders

Inkle Loom Weaving-\$TBD

Come and explore the fun of an inkle loom! No weaving experience necessary! This small, portable loom is one of the simplest looms around and its amazing potential is often overlooked and undervalued. The warp-faced, plain weave structure of inkle weaving is a creative playground for mixing yarn weights and fibers, showing off novelty yarns, and using space-dyed yarns to create special effects. Not only is the inkle loom easy and quick to warp and weave, it's a great way to use up small amounts of yarn from your stash with almost no loom waste. The inkle loom is ideal for weaving a band, belts, straps, accessories, bookmarks, and more! In this class, students will learn how to warp the loom and will then begin making a simple project, like a bookmark. After learning the basics, the instructor will teach students how to design and draft their own patterns for future use. Children ages 8-12 should enroll with or be accompanied by an adult. Materials needed: Inkle loom, scissors, tape measure, yarn

Tapestry Weaving—\$75

Tapestry weaving is a means of transforming visual images into a tactile art form. The diversity of small loom weaving, and the simplicity of a single shedding device make tapestry weaving the perfect approach to weaving on a budget. You will change colors, join parallel blocks of color, make freeform shapes, and experiment with applying these techniques to your sampler. \$TDB Materials fee paid to instructor. Chemical (Acid) Dyeing Workshop—\$125

Would you like to learn more about dyeing yarn? We'll use wash fast acid dyes to dye animal fibers a rainbow of colors! Learn how to prepare the yarn, mix the dyes, apply and set the dyes, and finish your personal hank of yarn. \$TBD Materials fee paid to the instructor. Materials needed: Bring old clothes & mask if preferred. The dyes we're using are permanent and will either stain or dye most fabrics.

15-hr session

Finishing Workshop—\$125

Have a closet full of sweater pieces? This is the class for you. In this class, we'll cover several different types of seams, crocheted edgings, buttonholes, and bands. We'll show you how to pick up stitches for the neckline, how to weave in those pesky ends, and how to block the sweater when you've got it all done. We'll also cover duplicate stitch, I-cord, and blocking techniques.

If you have them, bring pieces that need finishing, and we'll help you get started on the final touches of your masterpiece. If you don't have sweater pieces to bring, come to the workshop to learn all the techniques so that when you're done knitting your next sweater you'll know exactly what the next steps are. Materials needed: Bring at least 4 swatches,

2 in garter stitch and 2 in stockinette stitch, tapestry needles, and scrap yarn. Please use worsted weight yarn in light colors.

Rigid Heddle weaving doesn't have to be plain. We'll play with texture and hand manipulating the threads to create some very cool samples. Start with a warping refresher. 15-hr session

Rigid Heddle Weaving Workshop—\$75

Curious about weaving? The Rigid Heddle is the perfect way to see if you might like this marvelous art form. This class is designed to show you how to prepare your loom for weaving. Class covers the discussion of color, texture, calculating yarn requirements needed and the ins & outs of weaving while weaving a project. Materials needed: Loom, at least 550 yds yarn, scissors and tapestry needle. May use two different colors.

15-hr session

Tri-Loom Weaving Workshop—\$75

No previous experience required. Learn how to plain weave, make color changes and correct mistakes while creating a lovely woven scarf/shawl on a 3-ft tri-loom. **Materials needed:** Bring approximately 250 yds DK or worsted blended fiber & a crochet hook. Note: 100% wool, loosely spun, pin-roving or mohair not recommended.

15-hr session

Rigid Heddle Frame Loom: Direct Method Warping—\$TBD

Ready, set, weave! Learn the basics of the rigid heddle frame loom and weave scarves, table runners, shawls, pillow covers, etc. The rigid heddle frame loom is portable so you can take your project with you anywhere. In this class, you'll learn a super-efficient directmethod warping technique (warping with a peg instead of a warping board) which means you can be weaving in a few hours. You will leave class ready to plan and create your own projects. This class is great for students who want to find out if weaving is for them and it's also helpful for experienced rigid heddle weavers interested in learning a speedy warp alternative.
